AS Geography Brixton Trip



Our Y12 AS students recently went on a school trip to Brixton to study and analyse how the area has changed, Below is a summary of the trip by Y12 student Kim Trainor.

Brixton is an interesting place, both from an insider and outsider perspective. It is the arguably at the forefront of the new swathe of renovation and gentrification in London's sub-urbs- most famously seen in the transformation of Shoreditch. Although Brixton hasn't got to the extremes of cereal bars and beard grooming boutiques, a quick look into Pop Brixton (a construction created entirely from old shipping containers) will surely tell you that they aren't that far off. Brixton, however is a lot more complex than that. On the AS Geography trip to Brixton we tried to look at the area, not only in terms of its changing reputation, but also by how the area has been shaped over time- from the time it was a country retreat for the elites of Victorian society to the diverse culture filled place it is today. While walking past the Brixton Windmill, Electric Avenue and the countless murals and memorials, we found that Brixton is comprised of a very complex community tangled together by historical events which have only made them closer as a group. I believe that no matter how globalised Brixton will become, it will never become placeless- no matter how many coffee shops there are. Inevitably, the thing I learnt the most was that Brixton is filled with really good food and the residents are very friendly and enthusiastic about answering surveys.
