Our best ever exam results


Our students, parents and staff celebrated the incredible exam results achieved by our hardworking students in their GCSE, A level and IB examinations this summer.

The Academy's Year 11 students achieved excellent results with over 30% of all grades awarded at A* or A and over 80% achieving 5 or more subjects A*-C including English and Maths. Student, Jumana Jung achieved 11 A*s across the board in all her subjects and Freya Lewis was not far behind with 10 straight A*s and 1 A grade.



Our Year 13 students achieved equally impressive results with 86% of all grades awarded at A*-C and an average point score per student of 990. This year four students will be pursuing their degrees at the University of Cambridge and one student at the University of Oxford. For the past 4 years Ashcroft Sixth Form has won the Wandsworth Pupil Achievement Award which publicly recognises the successes of the Sixth Form. Students taking all programmes of study in the Sixth Form performed substantially above local and national statistics. We are particularly pleased with our sustained success with students making outstanding progress.

We are so proud of them all. The Academy's environment is one which encourages hard work and ambition, in which a disciplined approach, combined with high expectations, provides students with the determination and motivation to succeed. Our Year 11 and Year 13 cohort have certainly succeeded beyond expectations. In this context we would like to welcome a strong Year 12 into the sixth form and we look forward to working with our new Year 11 to help and support them to achieve their best and work on sixth form subject combinations in the near future.

Consent forms have been issued and should be returned to Mrs Williams, our Welfare Office, completed and signed as soon as possible, even if it is a negative consent.




