#### **IB Music Morning**



On Saturday 18 June the Performing Arts Department hosted an event for prospective IB Music students. The department is delighted to be offering the IB Music course to Year 12 students in September 2016, as part of the highly successful IB Diploma programme at ATA.

Prospective students took part in a creative and stimulating morning of performing, showcasing composition work and sitting a music theory exam. The department looks forward to working with such talented musicians.

## Spectroscopy in a Suitcase

The Royal College of Chemistry's Spectroscopy in a Suitcase (SIAS) scheme is an outreach activity which gives school students the chance to learn more about spectroscopy through hands-on experience. As well as covering the principles of spectroscopic techniques, the



activities use real-life contexts to demonstrate the applications of the techniques.

The event was delivered by three Chemistry students from Imperial College London (two undergraduates, Emily and Markaret and one PhD student, Haris) in conjunction with the Royal Society of Chemistry. There were two workshops attended by 53 of our Year 12 Chemistry students.

Students had the opportunity to use a range of portable spectroscopy instruments to generate spectra for different compounds. They also used spectra to identify unknown compounds as would be used in a Forensic Science laboratory. This was very good experience for the students linking well with their current learning and also much appreciated by them.

They were surprised to find out the cost of the portable NMR instrument priced at £70,000. So we extend our gratitude to the Royal Society for funding this resource and also to Imperial College and its students for delivering a fruitful event.



#### Prospective Year 7 Open Evening

We were pleased to welcome a number of Year 5 primary pupils and their parents to our first Open Evening for the September 2017 intake.

Although this was the first to take place at this time of year, due to changes in the way Wandsworth run their admissions programme, we were pleasantly surprised at the number that attended. The visitors were rewarded with interesting practical activities performed by our students across the curriculum and a welcome speech from our Principal.
