

Debate Mate Workshop

A representative from Debate Mate visited us this week to lead a workshop on debating skills for Year 9 students who had shown an interest in developing their speaking skills.



After an initial introduction on how to prepare for a debate the students were coached on their style of approach to an audience, how to engage their audience with well thought out content and their strategy to win their argument. In small groups they practised public speaking skills, argumentation development on for or against the subject 'This house believes the Government should be allowed to spy on citizens phone calls, texts and emails'.



Next they chose a speaker from their group to argue their point to the remaining student audience. With comments from the floor the speakers did very well in getting their

points across. The Debate Mate mentor was also very impressed with their effective communication and coherence. She said they were the best group of students she had coached and thought they would do very well in the Debate Mate competition.

Irrespective of prior experience, learning to debate is a sure-fire way to enhance key skills, deepen knowledge of current affairs, gain new perspectives and even improve academic attainment.
