on base. A Gamelan is the traditional orchestra of Indonesia and the Gamelan the students studied at the museum was from Bali.

Together, the students learnt and performed a very challenging piece of music called 'Baris' which would be used to accompany a war dance performed in

traditional costume. Mr Chadda, Miss Di Bartolo and the instructor were very impressed with Year 9's listening and ensemble skills!

Unusually for such a museum, you can see their collection up-close and face-to-face. You can even pick up, try on and play with some of the objects. They house extraordinary collections of anthropology and natural history as well as an aquarium. And it is free to enter!


We had full attendance from all 60 students who engaged well in the activities including identifying various molecules using spectra. In addition, samples were brought along with a portable spectrometer by the ambassadors and infrared spectra were obtained by the students.

The visitors were particularly complementary about the enthusiasm of the students who worked through various challenging identification tasks with support from teachers and ambassadors. The students benefitted from working with different groups of students from the year group for the first time particularly in the case of International Baccalaureate students who worked with A Level students with more experience of analysing spectra.
