Year 7 STEAM Club:

In Mega Maths with Mr Sellars, the Year 7 STEAMmies showed great enthusiasm as they discussed modelling techniques for the spread of disease. They saw how

social groups and gender helped influence spread of the terrible 'standing disease'! They then extended the model to see how many steps it would take to infect the whole world. It took 4 to infect the whole class and after some large over-estimations (3,000,000 – 3500,000,00). The STEAMmies found it would take just 33 steps to infect over 7 billion people. Great work from Year 7 and from Sixth Form STEAM Ambassador, Awes Mubarak, for helping out with this session.



Year 8 STEAM Club:

In Maths of Language with Mr Revelant, the STEAMmies competed against each other in a language game in which they had to communicate with each other but could not use some utterly unmentionable words (taboo words). This was an excellent starting point to explore how communication gets impaired



when our usual linguistic code gets disrupted because of the introduction of new rules. Well done Year 8s!
