The Modern Foreign Langauges Department at Ashcroft Technology Academy offers French to all students on entry in year 7. Students must study MFL up to GCSE level and consequently Spanish and Italian are offered as an additional option when students express their preferences in Year 8. KS4 studies therefore commence in earnest in year 9. The exam board used by the Academy is Edexcel.

French runs at A level and as a language option for The International Baccalaureate at SL/HL. Students at present can study Spanish at Ab Initio/Standard level and Italian at Ab Initio.

The department comprises a Curriculum Manager and five full-time teachers/one part-time. All classrooms have interactive whiteboards/visualisers and specific

The MFL team works in an integrated way and places great emphasis on teamwork, cooperation and collaborative planning.
