


National Storytelling Week

STEAM Academia & Sixth Form STEAM Ambassadors Programme - This week's session with Ms Khan included a special quest visit. Liz Danner from Understanding Animal Research presented about the UK's animal research regulations and laws compared to other countries from across the world. The Academics were fascinated to hear that in the UK no animal testing is allowed at all for any product! All trials or tests are done via regulated models, including virtual models, so that accurate and reliable data is collected. The sentient rights of animals was discussed, along with genetic engineering, and lots of stimulating Q&A ensued. Well done to our wonderful STEAM Academics!





Special STEAM event - Energy Quest:

A special STEAM event took place with Ms Khan in the Auditorium for 60 students from Years 7-9 with a visit by STEM Ambassadors Cristina Plant from Shell's Learn by Design Programme and Charlie Eales from energy provider EDF. Our STEAMmies learned about the diverse and exciting career pathways in Engineering, the various educational routes available to successful Engineering careers, renewable and non-renewable energy resources, and the promotion of women in STEM/STEAM/Science. Hands on active workshops kept our students stimulated, challenged and busily engaged. They practiced their data analysis skills as they researched energy production and energy efficiency from a range of different countries and concluded on the best energy resources to use for location. They tested their "STEAM" skills and built mini electric cars, investigating how far their cars would travel by changing the voltage applied and analysed their data by drawing a line of best fit graph and writing a scientific conclusion. Ned Delo's (7T4) group evaluated that the width of the Auditorium just wasn't enough distance to test their very impressive mini electric car, which was able to travel the furthest distance and was stopped only by the Auditorium wall!

It's certainly been full STEAM ahead! Well done, everyone! Looking forward to more STEAM-azing sessions next week!
