

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


Yet another STEAM-azing week at ATA and the second round of project rotations has been completed. Our STEAMmies are ready for round 3, which commences next Tuesday.

In Mega Maths with Mr Sellars, the Year 7 STEAMmies showed great enthusiasm, as they experimented with another model of disease spread: the



dreaded 'Counter Plague'! They started with one counter infected, then a die was rolled which would tell them if 0,1 or 2 counters would be infected next, dependent on the number rolled. Two different models were used and the STEAMmies drew graphs to represent the model. They found a very close relationship to the actual 1904 India plague, which started off exponentially (like the standing disease), then peaked and returned to zero. Praise is due for their enthusiasm and ability to spread (and model) disease!! Thanks again to Awes Mubarak 13T5 for his help guiding the STEAMmies in their approach to the task.

Year 10 STEAM Academia & Sixth Form STEAM Ambassadors:

A stimulating STEAM Academia session with Ms Khan, as we welcomed another STEAM guest, Miriam Franklin, Senior Consultant at IBM. Miriam presented about her educational background and career pathway – Chemistry, Physics, Maths and Further Maths at A level, and Chemical Engineering at degree level. Miriam read her degree at Cambridge University. Miriam's innovative work involves devising problem solving IT systems, with her current focus on efficient energy generation in nuclear power stations, and she shared her work on the latest nuclear power station model, which has proved to be energy efficient and very safe also in comparison to previous models implemented by the government. Miriam has worked with Artificial Intelligence in previous projects and presented about these also. Our STEAM audience was engrossed as Miriam presented how STEAM skills are a big part of her job. A Q&A session followed afterwards and a special request

made for Miriam to return so that our STEAM students could learn more about her work. A truly interesting session with a lot discovered about a potential STEAM career pathway.





Sixth Form Geography Lecture

On Tuesday, Sixth Form Geographers enjoyed a fascinating lecture about seismic activity in Nepal. The lecture was presented by Professor Alex Densmore from Durham University, who is one of the leading scientists investigating hazard and risk in this region of Asia. The lecture gave students an insight into the nature of the hazards faced by people in Nepal and the impacts of the 2015 earthquake. The lecture was followed by a question and answer session which challenged and enhanced the way students understand a number of aspects of plate tectonics.



Sixth Form Dodge Ball

As is tradition, the 6th form Dodge Ball on Friday 10th November was an exhilarating and exhausting event, showcasing the energy and enthusiasm of Ashcroft students. 48 sixth formers from years 12 and 13, A Level and IB took part, with as many spectators showing up to demonstrate their support and house loyalty. The games were fast paced and furious. There could be only one victor: Endeavour took home the title and 200 house points, with Voyager in 2nd place, Challenger in 3rd and Discovery in 4th. As well as hundreds of points being raised, the event demonstrated the best of the house system: healthy competition, enthusiasm and perseverance (even in the face of defeat!)

Year 13 Business trip to Redber Coffee

Mr McGuinness and Miss Sargeant took a group of year 13 business students to Redber Coffee, a coffee roasting business based in Guildford to see the business in operation and meet the owners and the employees.

On arrival, the students received a free coffee followed by a short presentation from the business coffee expert who explained about the different types of coffee farms around the world and the coffee traders who invest in coffee futures contracts, commodities trading and coffee prices. They also learned that coffee is the second most commonly traded commodity in the world (measured by monetary volume), trailing only as a source of foreign exchange to developing countries, according to the International Coffee Organization.

The students then spent time with the owner finding out about how he decided on his business venture, the set up costs, the running costs and how the budget is managed. The owner was keen to stress the importance of managing costs in any business.

At the end of the visit, the students received a free pack of ground coffee and a bar of chocolate. This was a great opportunity to see the theory of business in practice.
