Year 12 Changing Places Trip Last Friday afternoon as the rain poured, 22 hardy students from the AS Geography course travelled to Brixton to complete some fieldwork to support their understanding of the Changing Places module. The module focuses on how places are modified by a variety of different factors including; their history, gentrification, media, investment and migration. The students were able to look for evidence of these influences

present in Brixton. They were also able to talk to the residents of the area about their perceptions of these developments and their reactions to a changing Brixton. After developing their practical understanding of 'changing places', the group then had the opportunity to attend a lecture at St Mary's University. The lecture given by Prof. Alastair Owens gave invaluable insights into the theoretical basis for the module and how these concepts manifest themselves in the places around us.
