Throughout the day students skilfully sketched their surroundings whilst on the tube, in the gallery and on the banks of the Thames.




Debut Netball 2016



Year 8 'STEAMies' go Mega-Maths

Another excellent Mega-Maths session with great help from our 6th form ambassadors. This week Year 8 'STEAMies' continued with the World War II dam busting theme looking at the role of mathematical modelling. The 'STEAMies' started by drawing accurate scale drawings using a conversion between centimetres and feet. Not too difficult, except that this had to be combined with a conversion from yards to feet and drawn accurately on an A4 sheet. The task was to find the bomber's 'line of sight' angle when it was 425yds away.

Once the drawings were set up, the sixth formers introduced trigonometry and showed how we could use it to make the required calculations.

The 'STEAMies' concluded that scale drawings were preferable to trying to work out the angles from real life, but trigonometry was a much more accurate (and quick) way to find out the answer.
