#### **Imperial War Museum Trip**

Almost 100 Year 9 History students took part in a History enrichment trip to the Imperial War Museum (IWM) over two days this week to view the award-winning

Holocaust exhibition. The students learnt about the Holocaust and the persecution of the Jews in Nazi Germany as well as the rise of Hitler and fascism in Europe. The "personal stories section" was particularly harrowing displaying photographs, diaries, toys and film of the people who lived through the Holocaust. Testimonies from survivors bring a moving perspective to these objects while a model of Auschwitz-Birkenau



demonstrated the extent of events that occurred. This was a very rewarding and educational experience for the students. Many commented on the profound effect the many personal testimonies from Holocaust survivors had on them and how the

exhibition brought a real life context to the material they were covering in lessons.

The IWM staff who led the learning sessions on both days commented on the "maturity" and "dignity" our students demonstrated in the learning sessions and their conduct around the Holocaust exhibition. It was a pleasure to lead the trip and receive such positive comments about Ashcroft students from the staff at IWM.


During their visit they will deliver the six keys to success designed to help young people develop valuable life skills that will help them in and outside of school, now and into the future.

#### **STEAM trip to CERN**

Our five lucky STEAM-Honours students: Angus Stewart 9T4, Safa Khan 9T1, Hannah Colwell 8T2, Zohaa Sheikh 8T6 and Samuel Edmonson 8T5 are all set for their visit to the CERN Laboratories in Switzerland this week, where they will observe the working of the Large Hadron Collider.

The Large Hadron Collider (LHC) is the world's largest and most powerful particle collider, most complex experimental facility ever built, and the largest single machine in the world. The aim of the LHC is to allow physicists to test the predictions of different theories of particle physics, including measuring the properties of the Higgs Boson and searching for the large family of new particles predicted by supersymmetric theories, as well as other unsolved questions of physics.

This trip was awarded to Ashcroft Technology Academy's STEAM Club at the House of Lords STEM Inspiration Awards event back in November, when we won the Best STEM Club 2016 award. We look forward to hearing all about their trip when they return.

#### **STEAM Design**

In Mrs Aldred-Hall's Textiles Rocket Club, the Year 9



STEAMies made rapid progress with their rockets and started working on their soft circuits. Particular praise to Krisztian Hunter 9T5, who completed a hand stitched circuit in his rocket key ring in just half an hour! Well done!

In Mr Morrissey's Rocket Car Club, the Year 9 STEAMies cut out aerodynamic shapes for their cars. They then focused on using the sanding tools to make the shapes smooth. They also shaped the front to improve wind resistance



and to ensure that their cars are very fast when finished.

In Mr Revelant's Maths of Language Club, the Year 8 STEAMies found out about different codes that were used in History by Emperors and Kings, and appreciated the difficulty of cracking codes. The STEAMies familiarised themselves with the Morse Code and Caesar Shifts.

excited and de-excite, giving off different ranges of coloured light when they absorbed photons from the Sun.


They were able to relate this phenomenon to the different colour flames of a Bunsen burner and deduce the energy variations

for the different colours. The STEAMies also looked at the Coriolis effect of the Earth on water as a result of its relative movement. An enthusiastic session with a lot of very high order questions answered.
