In small groups they practised public speaking skills, argumentation development on for or against the subject 'This house believes the Government should be allowed to spy on citizens phone calls, texts and emails'.



Next they chose a speaker from their group to argue their point to the remaining student audience. With comments from the floor the speakers did very well in getting their

points across. The Debate Mate mentor was also very impressed with their effective communication and coherence. She said they were the best group of students she had coached and thought they would do very well in the Debate Mate competition.


